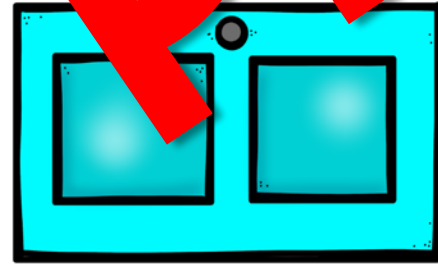

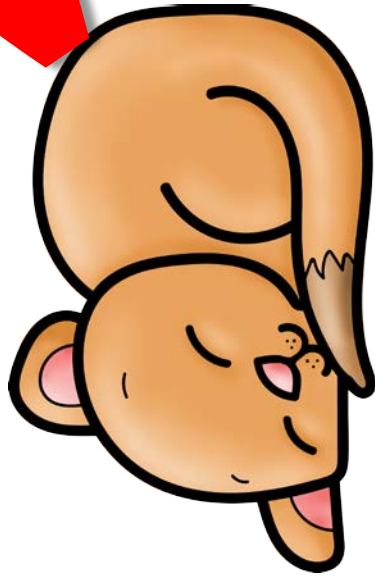

6 Syllable Types

1. Closed

Syllables with a single vowel followed by one or more consonants, the vowel makes its short sound (VC/CV or VC/V pattern)



kit-ten



com-et

3. Controlled

Syllables that have an *r* following the vowel(s), the *r* "controls" the vowel sound

5. Vowel team

Syllables with two vowels that are not a diphthong (these include vowel digraphs like *ee*, *oo*, etc.) and vowel pairs (like *oi*, *oy*, etc.)

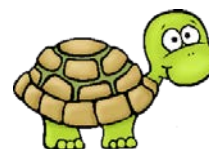

6. Consonant + le

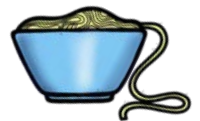
Syllables with a consonant followed by an *-le*, these are unaccented syllables and found at the end of words

CLOSED VC/CV Syllables

Teaching Tips for Closed VC/CV Syllables

1. Teach students to first look for the **vowel** in the word. Learners can circle the vowels or label/code them using “v” for vowel.
2. Once the vowels are highlighted, teach them to look for the **consonants** in **between** the vowels. Learners can underline the consonants or label/code them using “c” for consonants.
3. When there are **two** consonants between the vowels, divide the word between the two consonants (Examples: *kit-ten* and *mag-net*) Because there are consonants at the end of each syllable, it “closes in” the vowels. Closed-syllable vowels make their short sound.
4. For struggling readers, it may help to start with double consonant words such as *kitten* or *muffin*. Double consonants like this are easy to spot because they stand out. Move next to words with two different consonants like *magnet* or *zigzag*. Teaching the *-er* suffix on extends the closed syllable words you can use in your instruction. Words like *hammer* and *number* can be added to your list.

*When there are **THREE** consonants in between the vowels, ask learners to look for consonant pairs (blends or digraphs). They stick together. Example: *bath-tub*. Page 12 and 24 of this file contain words with three consonants in between the vowels.
